Former pastor

dies in Iowa

The Rev. Walter Evans Kellison, former pastor of the Universalist Unitarian Church of Farmington, is dead of cancer at the age of 62.

He died Sept. 9 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, where for the past 13 years he served as pastor of the Peoples Unitarian Church and participated in numerous community and denominational activities.

Following cremation, a memorial service was held in the church Sept. 14.

Rev. Kellison was pastor of the Farmington church from 1956 to 1962. During that time he served a term as president of the Michigan Council of Liberal Churches.

In Iowa, he was a member of Gov. Harold Hughes' commission on social welfare programs, helped organize and headed the Cedar Rapids chapter of the National Council of Christians and Jews, and was named to the mayor's committee on low rent housing.

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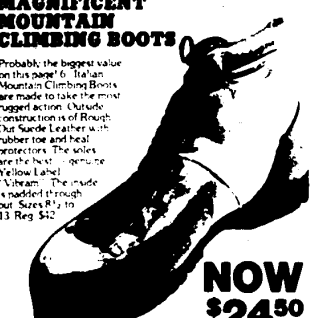
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
