

Southfield firm to repair Detroit Race Course

If Detroit Race Course receives the racing dates it desires in 1976 from the Michigan State Racing Commission, a 90-night Wolverine harness meeting will commence on April 5 with a 119 day thoroughbred season following on July 20.

Whatever the gateway date in the country's Bicentennial year, the track's harness horsemen will be greeted with a brand new 300-stall horse barn and a neighboring 100-room clubhouse in DRC's big back-

stretch area. Plans for the \$600,000 complex were first announced by board chairman Frederick L. Van Lennep, who said construction will begin immediately following the close of the current harness meeting Oct. 18.

Van Lennep, who heads Castleton Industries said, "The construction is a part of the continuing improvement program which was initiated when we purchased DRC in 1969. Some \$2,100,000 has already been spent on the upfitting of track facilities and we

have several other definite projects formulated for the next few years."

Van Lennep said some six or seven of the older wooden barns will be torn down in addition to the building of the new steel and concrete barn and clubhouse. Handling the construction will be the Kay-Bee Construction Co. of Southfield which is owned by twin-

brothers Terry and Leslie Greshlight.

The Greshlights also campaign a highly successful thoroughbred racing stable which this year has been under the direction of DRC's champion trainer Jack Faran.

Van Lennep and John R. (Jack) Davis, president of the Detroit Racing Association which sponsors the thor-

oughbred meetings at DRC, cited other improvements which have been made on the 26-year-old racing plant since it was bought by Castleton Industries six years ago.

NEW BARN and clubhouse already added, plus continuing improvements to the mile race track itself, have been a start toward elevating

DRC to a position among the major race tracks in the country. New modern track and parking lot lights, extensive paving of both parking and pasture ramp areas, a new outside paddock and the finishing and modernization of the clubhouse (fourth floor have brought the initial renovating and refurbishing costs to the \$2 million-plus figure.

SUMMARY
CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
AUGUST 23, 1975

The regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council was held on August 23. Present were Council Members Deacon, Dolan, Dudley, Lachman, McConnell, Oppenheimer, and Orman.

Standing Resolution No. 3 for road improvement on New Market Street from Twelve Mile Road to Farmington Road adopted unanimously by Council.

Council approved Mayor Oppenheimer's nomination of Mr. Jean Fox to the Citizens Advisory Committee for the Northwestern Highway Environmental Impact Study.

Council acknowledged receipt of a letter under date of August 30, 1975 from Farmington School Board notifying the City that a decision had been made not to honor their commitment of last year to pay a portion of the cost of Hill Road paving.

Council unanimously approved the City's support of the merger of the Oakland County Department of Public Works with the Oakland County Drain Commission and Council Member Robert McConnell was designated to be the City's representative at the September 18, 1975 meeting.

Mayor approved to instruct the acting City Manager to proceed with the City of Livonia in implementing the H1 system and to instruct the Director of Public Safety to report to the Council on the status of implementing the system for the entire community.

Mayor approved that the final day for payment of property taxes without interest penalties be established as September 2, 1975.

Council approved by vote of six to one the enactment of Amendment Ordinance No. 28233 Councilmember Orman opposed.

Consideration of Resolution for application for the City of Farmington Hills to be recognized as a Bicentennial City approved by a vote of six to one Councilmember Lachman opposed.

Council unanimously approved acceptance of \$10,000 bid from Dictaphone Corporation for a ten-channel recorder for the Police Department.

Council unanimously approved the request for transfer of stock interest in 1975 Class C (leaved corporation with Denver Permit located at 2102 Orchard Lake Road from Thomas Nolan to Robert C. McDonald and Robert M. Francha.

Council unanimously approved the request for Harrison High School Homecoming Parade for October 4, 1975.

Council authorized the City to enter into an agreement with Wayne County Road Commission relative to the installation of storm sewer facilities and Eight Mile right-of-way on behalf of Bethlehem Lutheran Church.

Consideration of establishing Special Assessment District for sewer in Treman's Little Farm Subdivision, Standard Resolution No. 1, unanimously approved.

Council authorized City Manager to investigate sources and costs for a Master Plan for park acquisition and development and report back to Council in four weeks as to his specific recommendations.

Meeting adjourned 10:30 P.M.
