The meet was decided by No. 2 doubles when Lathrup's Carol Dawes and Nancy Glen defeated Judith Anderson and Della Jampel in three tough sets, 6-2, 6-7, 6-3. "They came back under pressure, but they missed a golden opportunity to win it in the second set," Waits said. "Still, they won, and that meant that we won, which meant that every body was very happy."

The victory lifted Lathrup to 5-3 this season. Lathrup will participate in the state regional tournament Oct. 10-11 at Royal Oak Kimball. Other teams in the regional: Southfield High, Kimball, Clawson, Farmington Our Lady of Mercy, Royal Oak Dondoro, Detroit Pershing and Madison Heights Lamphre.

Farmington Harrison continued its fine tennis season with a 5-2 victory over city-rival North Farmington last week.

In No. 1 singles, Harrison's Janice Lukasiewicz stopped Cindy Ford, 3-1 in the first set before Miss Ford had to withdraw because of an injury. North Farmington's Patty Schuerman and Carolyn Chupinski defeated Carol and Linda Nosanchuk, 7-5, 6-2, in No. 3 doubles.

The win was Harrison's fourth straight this season and its 13th in a row over the past two seasons. The three Farmington high schools—Harrison, North Farmington and Farmington High—will play in the Bloomfield Hills Laker regional Oct. 10 at various schools in the district. Some other entries: Bloomfield Hills Laker, Bloomfield Hills Andover, West Bloomfield, Waterford, Waterford Mont., Waterford Kettering, Walling Lake Central, Walling Lake Western, Milford Lakeland.

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy beat Bishop Borgess, 8-0, in a non-league meet last week. The victory was the first of the season for coach Linda Barber and her first-year Mercy crew.

"Borgess seemed to have a very young team," Miss Barber said. "They were late getting started and they're not even in the league yet. Still it was great to win—that was our first victory ever. Several of our players seem to be doing a lot better. In particular, Betty Spreen, our No. 1 singles, seems to have it together."

Miss Spreen defeated Mary Weinburger, 6-7, 6-3, 6-4. In No. 1 doubles, Mercy's Beth and Patty Hackett defeated Debbie Blum and Ann Roberts, 6-0, 6-0.

Jane MacLaren was a double winner in North Farmington's 110-80 victory over Westland John Glenn in a Northwest Suburban League girls' swimming meet last Thursday.

Miss MacLaren, who attended Farmington Mercy and helped the Marlins win the state meet two years ago, won the 200-yard individual medley (2:35.8) and the 100-yard breaststroke (1:41.9) against Glenn. Teammate Debbie Hatch also won two events—the 200-yard freestyle (2:17.7) and the 100-yard butterfly (1:12.9).

North Farmington, now 4-1 overall and 1-1 in the NSL, won every event except diving.

"We really didn't swim that well this week," said North Farmington coach Pat Duthe. "The girls weren't really pressured to swim well."
