Love spells are hazardous if they are cast lightly

Day in and day out, year after year, more than half the letters that cross my desk continue to ask for love spells. Because of this, I have decided to devote this week's entire column to spells of that nature.

But please, let me offer one word of warning: Before you cast a spell of this kind upon another individual, be absolutely certain that you really want that person.

Hardly a week goes by that I don't also receive a few letters like this one:

So I am offering these spells, but cautioning you to proceed carefully.

AMARYLLIS BULB

Get yourself an amaryllis bulb from a grocery store or nursery, and plant it according to directions on the package. It is best to get a red one, symbolizing passion. Name this plant after the man you love, and speak to it as if it were this man. Each morning, when you arise, go to the plant and say, "Good Morning," and tell it good night every night before you go to sleep.

Careless this plant and love it, just as if it really were this man. Never cry or be sad around this plant, always be happy and cheerful. As this flower grows, so will this man's love for you. And when the flower blossoms, his love for you will also bloom.

For an extra boost in the growth of this plant, try to obtain a small bit of your loved one's hair and place it in the soil with the bulb.

CANDLE LOVE SPELL

Obtain two candles, one in the shape of a man, the other the shape of a woman. You can buy such candles at various boutiques and candle shops, but it is better if you make them yourself, using warm beeswax.

Shape the male candle to look like the man for whom the spell is being worked. The woman candle should resemble the woman involved in the spell. You don't have to be an artist. Just do the best you can. If the man is tall and thin, don't make a short, fat candle.

Dress these candles with a mixture of sandalwood and rose oil, with a few drops of patchouli added. Place each candle on a three-inch square of virgin parchment. Then place them on the floor so that the distance between them is equal to the average of the combined heights of the two people involved. (For example: If the man is six feet tall, and the woman is five feet tall, the candles should be placed five and a half feet apart.)

On the first night, burn the candles down to the necks, all the while thinking of his her mind being consumed with thoughts of you. On the second night, move them halfway toward the center and burn them to the waist, this time thinking of their hearts burning with love for each other. On the third and last night, place the candles together, facing each other, and burn them completely, thinking of the two being consumed by passion and desire.

While the candles burn each night, you should be resting, and thinking only of the man or woman for whom the spell is worked. Picture them together, laughing and loving. Do not be sad, for happy vibrations are necessary if the spell is going to work. During the three nights you work the spell, you should be alone, avoid talk-

ing and being with others on these nights.

SPELL FOR A MAN TO WORK ON A WOMAN

Put a leaf from a tree (preferably ash) in your mouth, and turning to the sun, speak the following:

Sun of heat, Sun of light,
Bind my lover's heart tight.
Never let her run from me,
So our love will ever be.

Then take the ash leaf and cut it into 13 pieces, and add it to food that your love will eat. If she swallows just one section of the leaf, she'll be moved to true-hearted love as complete as yours.

CORIANDEER LOVE SPELL

Crush seven coriander seeds together with one rose hip. Place this, with one-fourth cup distilled water, in a new cup which has never been used, and allow it to sit for 24 hours. If you are a woman, strain this liquid through a clean stocking which you have worn. A man may use one of his clean undershirts. Pour this liquid into a small bottle and carry it with you. The next time you are near the one you love, sprinkle this into his food or drink.

GETTING ONE TO LOVE YOU

is one thing, and getting him to marry you is another. If marriage is what you desire, try a little cinnamon, which has been used through the ages to increase a feeling of domesticity.

A half-hour before your date arrives, burn cinnamon incense in your home, so that the faint fragrance of cinnamon is still in the air when he arrives. You may also use cinnamon oil to put him in a mood of domesticity. Place a small drop of the oil on a cool, unlit light bulb.
