It is normal not to lead the club for it simply uses up West's natu-ral trump trick.

At several tables, West led the ace of spades in the hope of forcing declarer to ruff and thereby weaken the trumps. Dummy showed this to be hopeless, so a diamond was led to dummy's sin-gleton ace.

Two founds of trumps told the told mews. Declarer can now win the diamond king and ruff a dia-mond. He now should play two high spades ending in dummy and lead a small club.

At this point each hand has five

nigh spades ending in dummy and lead a small club.

At this point each hand has five cards and East has one diamond and four clubs. If East makes the mistake of playing the king or queen, one of declarer's losers disappears.

East can lead a diamond and give declarer a ruff and discard or a club into dummy's ace-ten.

The defense isn't casy. If East stops to think, he should play low-He is in trouble in any event if South has the club jack.
