

MAEDC plans for busy year

The newly elected officers of the Oakland County Chapter, Michigan Association for Emotionally Disturbed Children (MAEDC), have planned a busy year for the chapter.

Mrs. Sue Cooper, of Royal Oak, is Chapter President. She recently said MAEDC's major goal for the upcoming year is to involve more parents in activities.

"We need the continuing support and participation of professionals and concerned citizens, but our group began as a parent group and still focuses on parents," she said.

"Our meeting topics for the year were selected on the basis of what parents want and need to know. Four of our officers are parents of disturbed children, so we didn't have any trouble suggesting possible topics," she said.

The other chapter officers include Mrs. Judy Szulborski of Madison Heights, first vice president; Mr. Lynn Sigurdson of Detroit, second vice president; Mrs. Shirley Keene of

Hazel Park, secretary; and Mrs. Rose Marie Nowicki of Bloomfield Hills, treasurer.

The chapter's next public meeting, "Focus on the Family," will be held in January. Parents will have a chance to discuss the impact of an emotionally disturbed child on other family members.

The chapter also plans to have public meetings which deal with financial problems that families with disturbed children often face, child management, and opportunities for vocational training.

Right now chapter members are involved in the annual Christmas card campaign. The sale of MAEDC cards designed by children and young adults helps finance chapter projects, such as providing camp scholarships and operating a summer swim program.

English-Yiddish flyer tells of area services

The Jewish Community Council of Metropolitan Detroit has published and distributed a one-page, bilingual flyer of vital community supported services available to residents of Wayne and Oakland Counties through Jewish and non-Jewish community and governmental agencies.

Printed in English and Yiddish, the flyer provides information about the names and telephone numbers of agencies which provide services such as nursing aid, personal and family counseling, financial assistance, legal and dental referrals, veteran's and Social Security benefits, homemaker assistance, and food stamps.

Information contained in the flyer was compiled by members of the Jewish Community Council's Internal Re-

lations Committee, under the guidance of Mrs. Albert Rosenbaum. Each of the agencies cited were contacted in advance and have approved their listing on the flyer.

"OUR GOAL in compiling and distributing this flyer," Mrs. Rosenbaum explained, "is to help inform senior citizens and needy members of the metropolitan Jewish community about where to turn when they find themselves facing pressing problems. Each of these services and resources is made possible through their tax dollars and charitable contributions, and are provided by governmental and voluntary agencies."

"We thought it especially important that a bilingual English-Yiddish version of this flyer be printed and distributed. We hope that this will make the information more accessible to older members of the community who may be more easily conversant and literate in Yiddish, their 'mother tongue'."
