## Roosevelt May Complete Work on Canal

When he made his famous statement on the night of election, 1904, now the question is, what will he do after he leaves the White House?

"While I have not discussed the question with the president, I feel that the one great work for him to do, after leaving the White House, is to complete the construction of the Panama canal. He is the man to carry this great undertaking to a successful conclusion. It would link his name with this great waterway and preserve it for all time to come."

"President Roosevelt has the energy, the force, the determination and the ability to push the work to a speedy completion. I do not know that the president would undertake this task, if requested, as I am satisfied that his selection and acceptance of the appointment would give general satisfaction."

# THE COOK-PEARY SCRAP WARMS UP

WHITNEY CORROBORATES THE STORY TOLD BY COOK OF DISCOVERY.

## PEARY STILL DENIES IT.

Says Whitney Does Not Play Any Part Whatever in the Controversy as to the Doctor's Claim.

Harry Whitney, of New Haven, who with Dr. Frederick A. Cook at Annotok and to whom Dr. Cook is said to have given a detailed account of his trip to the Pole has sent a wireless message from Indian Harbor, Labrador, in answer to the question: "Did Cook reach the Pole?" Whitney says: "I have no reason to doubt Cook's statement." He was told by Dr. Cook at Etah that he had reached the Pole. Whitney says that he was at the Strathcona, via Indian Harbor and Cape Ray, N. F.

She was once criticized, however, for her efforts to secure a conviction of New York, whom she sought to redeem after he had been released from Elmira. She took him to churches, moving picture shows and to the hands of education him, but he fell from grace.

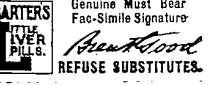
